# Updates

We have had a very good start to the new school year at Hornbill School. Since working together as a full Senior Leadership Team, we have been looking at ways to make Hornbill School even better. One way we have identified is to make the most of the time that we have your children in school and we have supported teachers to further develop their class timetables.

With this newsletter, each class teacher will be sending home their new class timetable and a Year Group Curriculum Statement. This will give you an overview of the school day and, a look into the curriculum your children will be engaging with this term. Please can we ask that you check the new timetable to see where PE, Jungle School, and for some classes, Swimming are in the week.

I am also pleased to be able to let you know that Mr Bowles will be teaching in Year 1 and Mrs J Brown will be teaching in Year 3 for part of the morning session. By adding these two teachers into the classes we are able to offer smaller teaching groups which will focus on developing all children to be the best they can be.

Mr Bowles will also be offering Jungle School to pupils and, Mr Brown and Mr Tomlin will still be offering high quality Art and PE lessons to pupils from FS2 to Year 6 each week. Most pupils will also have an extra session with Mr Tomlin each week to support our commitment to healthy lifestyles.

Our curriculum offer is also expanding as Mrs J Brown will also be teaching French to all pupils in Key Stage Two.

There is more good news for children in Foundation Stage and Key Stage 1 (Year 1 and Year 2). From Tuesday 27th September at every break time we will be offering those children, a piece of fruit, this will be given free of charge. It is provided by Defence Children Services as part of the Fruit and Vegetables scheme to encourage healthy eating. You are still welcome to send your child in with a small snack for the first break time. The fruit is locally provided, our provider is aware it is for children and are carefully selecting the fruit for us. The fruit will be washed in school before the children are offered it and we hope they will enjoy it.

We are all looking forward to seeing as many of you as possible in school tomorrow for our parent hour which will take place between 07:45 and 09:15 (FS1 and FS2 08:15-09:15) and to our Hornbill Helping Hands coffee morning from 09:15-10:00.
