Parent Questionnaire - 3 Answers

Each month we will be sharing with you how we are going to respond to your very valuable comments in order to further improve our outstanding practices.

Dressing Up Days

Question: Do children need to dress up for Launch and Landing Pads?

Answer: The simple answer here is no. But... Our Launch Pads are a way of getting children excited about the themes that they are going to learn throughout the term. One way to engage children is to ask them to dress up in some way like their theme.

Dressing up also tells your child that the learning today is different from the normal day to day routine.

We always try and give you at least a weeks notice before we ask you to provide a costume for the theme. However, we are conscious that this is not always the case and we are working hard to rectify this.

Next year we are planning to change our current procedures and this will cut down on the number of dress up days per year.

Reporting Progress to Parents

Question: Can you report my child's progress more regularly?

Answer: Progress and attainment is reported to parents at the end of each academic year as

part of your child's Annual Reports. We report Teacher Assessment in your child's progress and attainment for all core subjects (Reading, Writing, Grammar, Spelling and mathematics).

We also report the outcomes of Government Annual Tests for core subjects in Year 2, Year 6 and Phonics Testing in Year 1.

Mid-year progress and attainment is shared via a 2 page report at the Mid-year Parent Meeting.

However, if you would like a quick update on your child's progress and attainment please make an appointment to see your child's class teacher.

Events on Saturday?

Question: Can the school open for more events on Saturday?

Answer: As a school we are required to teach children for 190 days each academic year. Moving outside of these days is not possible.

There are some teachers who willingly give up their free time to run additional sessions - for which we are extremely thankful. However, we are not able to ask teachers to work additional hours.

The residential enables all children to deepen their independent skills and begin to understand the importance of looking after themselves.

Activities on offer move children out of their comfort zones and allow them safe opportunities for risk taking and development of team work.







Update

Labi School update.

As introduced in a previous edition of the Hornbill Gazette, the school council is leading Hornbill School in a project to support a local school in Labi.

One of our first actions as a school was to launch a **shoe donation appeal**. This was in response to the observation that many children at the school only wore flip flops or similar style footwear. After school these children work with their families in the fields farming in the same footwear.

So the school council set up a donation box. S Sgt Lee Smith from '7 Flight AAC and Mrs Karen Smith (Hornbill School LSA) recently took the donated shoes to the Labi school. S Sgt Smith wrote:

'It was amazing to see that such a small gesture of some pre-loved shoes could make someone so happy!'

This donation is still ongoing so please donate

any shoes that are still in good condition but are not needed anymore. A donation box can be found in the school reception.

During book week a book donation box was also set up and many books were kindly donated. These books were also taken to the school. S Sgt Smith also wrote:

'I have never seen children become so enthused about reading, with many of them signing the new books out immediately to take home and read. The teachers were over the moon... the books were a breath of fresh air.'

The money raised through the school discos has been used to buy various playground games and PE resources. The school council is planning to visit the Labi school in June to deliver these resources and to show the children how to use them.

It is wonderful to hear that our actions and values here are having a positive effect on the lives of other children in Brunei.
