## **Extended Learning Programme:**

We are currently finalising our arrangements for clubs at the beginning and end of our school day and will be writing to you next week to share this term's opportunities. Please don't hesitate to let us know if you have any suggestions or would be happy to help us with our club provision!

#### Prime:

I am aware that Prime Energy and Prime Hydration have arrived here in Brunei over the last week and we have had a few cases of children bringing bottles of 'Prime Hydration' to school.

Although there are no health risks to children associated with drinking 'Prime Hydration', the drink does contain a high level of electrolytes. Electrolytes aren't recommended for children unless they are unwell or at risk of dehydration.

Another form of the drink, 'Prime Energy', contains around 200mg of caffeine for every 330ml and as a result is not recommended for children under the age of 18.

As a result, the school has taken the decision to ban all forms of the Prime drink. Children should therefore not bring it to school as part of their lunchtime drinks.

## **Chicken Pox:**

We have had a confirmed case of chicken pox and a suspected case within our Foundation Stage classes. Chicken Pox is usually a childhood illness that typically presents itself as a few days of feeling unwell with fever and flu-like symptoms followed by the appearance of small fluid filled blisters mainly on the trunk of the body. Please be aware of these signs of illness and take your child to the doctor if the blister type rash appears. If the doctor confirms chicken pox, please let the school know so we can monitor the illness and take necessary steps to limit its spread. Children can only return to school once the blisters have healed and there are no new spots – this can take up to a week or more depending on each child.

#### **Return to School After Illness**

If a child is returning to school with medication following a period of illness, the parents/carers must be sure that the child is well enough to attend school before bringing them back. If there is any doubt, parents should seek advice before bringing them into school. If your child requires ongoing medication during school time, please contact the office to complete the appropriate permissions.

# **Volunteering Within Our School:**

We are keen to encourage volunteering here at school. Working offering your services as a parent helper is a great way to gain some insights into what actually goes on during the school day – and in some cases, could even pave the way for a school-based career.

Volunteering in a school can take many different forms. We are keen to offer our children help at playtimes

– perhaps you could share some traditional playground games with groups of children (things like 'What's the Time Mr Wolf' or 'Ring-a-Ring-a-Roses') or allow children opportunities to develop their conversational skills. Maybe you would be happy to help children to consolidate their learning in maths by playing some simple maths games or rapidly recalling number facts? Giving time to read with children would be invaluable or perhaps you would like to help us to keep our school library organised and tidy... Whatever you can think of – we would be grateful for your help! Volunteering at school is a great way to help us in our work to support your child in their learning. It is also a brilliant way to show your child the partnership between you and the school, so that

they can see us working together for their good. The role of volunteers can vary, so it is a good way to develop new skills and meet new people.

All volunteers will be invited to complete a Volunteer Information Sheet with their contact details, and complete the Volunteer Agreement which sets out the school's expectations of volunteers but, just as importantly, explains what volunteers can expect from our school. Prospective volunteers will also be required to complete safeguarding training, learning how we keep children safe and ensuring that we are vigilant of signs of risk or harm. If working without direct supervision, volunteers will also be required to complete a routine Disclosure and Barring Service check, to ensure that there is nothing in their background that may pose a risk to children, before starting to help in school. If you do have some free time and would like to get involved we would really value your contribution. Please contact the school office to express interest. Thank you.

**Celebration Assembly:** On Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> of September, we will recognise the achievement of some of our pupils during our first Celebration Assembly of the school year. Parents will receive an invitation to this event if their child is going to receive an award during this assembly.
