Attendance

Please find attached to this email a letter from Defence Children's Services Education Welfare Officer, Jane Kelly, which I have been asked to share with our families.

At Hornbill School, we take attendance and punctuality very seriously. We aim to have an attendance figure in excess of the national average of 96.7%. Attendance data is tracked by the Department for Education.

Obviously, attendance levels can be affected by illness. However, we would encourage all parents to send their children into school wherever possible. However, if your child is too ill to attend school, please ensure that the office is notified promptly, so we are aware that your child is safe.

If your child should be affected by sickness and/or diarrhoea, please remember that you must keep your child off of school until they have been <u>symptom free</u> for a minimum of 48 hours. This is to prevent the bug spreading throughout the school community.



The end of term is fast approaching, along with the Christian celebration of Christmas.

Christians celebrate Christmas to commemorate the birth of Jesus Christ, the Son of God, and the incarnation, when God became human. Christmas is a time of gratitude, remembrance, and celebration of the importance of faith, love, generosity, and service.

Here at Hornbill School, children in FS2, Year 1 and Year 2 will learn about the story of the Nativity and are excited to share their learning by performing Nativities sharing the Christmas story to their parents and any interested party from our local community.

Children in Years 3 to 6 will be sharing a Christingle service with families. A Christingle celebration is a festive candlelit service that brings together families and communities to share the light of Jesus and spread hope. The celebration usually takes place from the end of November through to February, but can be held at any time.

The symbolism

- Each part of the Christingle has a special meaning:
- The orange: Represents the world
- o The red ribbon: Represents Jesus' love and the blood he shed to save humankind
- The sweets or dried fruit: Represent God's creations and the blessings people are grateful for
- The four sticks: Represent the four seasons or the four corners of the world
- The candle: Represents Jesus as the Light of the World, bringing hope to those in darkness

The celebration culminates with children receiving a lighted (please be reassured that this will be a battery-operated candle) Christingle, gradually filling the space with light.

We are delighted to share that Father Christmas will be flying over to Brunei to visit our children here at Hornbill school. His elves have been very busy preparing presents for this event and are all very excited – but would really appreciate any adult support to wrap the presents.
